**Prosecco Valdobbiadene Brut, Jeio, Bisol, NV, Veneto, Italy** £37.50

One of the best quality Proseccos that you can find. Very refreshing but with some depth this is a great value alternative to Champagne

**Brut di Pinot Nero Rose, Ruggeri NV, Veneto, Italy** £42.50

A beautiful Italian sparkling Rose that has good citrus and fruit flavours. A fantastic way to start your meal

**Piper Heidsieck Brut, NV, Champagne** £52.50

One of the most famous names in Champagne this wine speaks for itself

## WHITE WINE

**Sauvignon Blanc, Domaine de Ribaute, Languedoc, France, 2008** £20.00

A very pleasant and drinkable sauvignon from the sunny south of France

**Chardonnay Benchmark, Grant Burge, Southern Australia, 2008** £23.50

A new world chardonnay that is really true to the flavour of the grape without being over powered by too much oak as can often be the case

**Chenin Blanc, Mulderbosch, Stellenbosch, South Africa, 2008** £26.50

From the best region in South Africa this is a lovely wine and offers a great alternative to the better known Chardonnay grape

**Pinot Grigio delle Venezie, Riff, Terra Alpina, Italy, 2008** £29.00

One of the best examples of this ever popular wine from the north of Italy, it is rare to find a Pinot Grigio of this quality

**Sauvignon Blanc, Hunter's, Marlborough, New Zealand, 2008/9** £32.50

A fantastic and typical example of a high quality Sauvignon Blanc from New Zealand's finest wine making region. Full of grassy, gooseberry and citrus flavours this wine will not disappoint

**Chablis, Jean Marc Brocard, Burgundy, France, 2008** £36.00

This wine needs no introduction being one of the most popular wines from France. This particular wine is a classic young Chablis offering some complexity but light enough to please all

**Albarino, Terras Gauda, Galicia, Spain, 2008** £40.00

Albarino's rise in popularity is due to the great quality of these wines grown in the far north of Spain. Steely in nature but with excellent depth

**Sancerre, Henri Bourgeois, Loire, France, 2008** £46.00

One of the most famous regions for white in in France, this is a really great example of an old world Sauvignon Blanc. Highly recommended

**Montagny 1er Cru "Le Vieux Chateau", Jean Marc Boillot, Burgundy, 2007** £62.50

A premiere cru burgundy that offers fantastic value when compared to the likes of Puligny-Montrachet though easily comparable in nature and quality

## ROSE

**Cabernet Sauvignon Syrah Rose, Vina Morande, Central Valley, Chile, 2008** £22.50  
A classic New World rose. Full of fruit and red fruit flavours this is on the dry side but very refreshing

**Cotes de Provence Rose, Domaine Gavoty, Provence, France 2008** £36.00  
A really good wine from the south of France. This is fantastic example of what makes this particular wine region famous.

## RED WINE

**Merlot, St Bernard, Languedoc, France, 2008** £20.00  
A great easy drinking wine that has all of the softness that a merlot should have

**Old Vine Garnacha, Principe de Viana, Navarra, Spain, 2007/8** £23.50  
Offering great value for money this wine shows the flavours and characteristics of a much older and more expensive wine

**Malbec, Valle Perdido, Patagonia, Argentina, 2006/7** £27.00  
This is the grape that has made Argentina famous for its wines and is celebrated throughout the wine world. Beautiful and full bodied this offers exceptional quality! You cannot fail to enjoy and be impressed by it. Particularly good with steak and meat!

**Valpolicella Allegrini, Veneto, Italy, 2008** £29.00  
A light and delicate grape gives subtle favours to this very drinkable wine from the north of Italy

**Shiraz Omrah, Western Australia, 2006** £34.00  
Known as Syrah throughout the old world this grape has come to optimize Australian reds. Full bodied and spicy this really is a fantastic wine

**Rioja Reserva, Cune, Spain, 2005** £40.00
